One of the many jewels in the Hanney Crown is of course our Community Woodland.

Main man for supplying the TLC it needs is Paul Sayers.

All who enjoy it owe him a debt of gratitude! Here's an update he sent out mid-June, and apols I was not able to include it in the July issue.

'After several months when much of the Woodland has been impassable due to standing water and churned up mud, it is at last drying out a bit. It is now possible to walk all the way around the perimeter, albeit skirting muddy patches in some places. However, the area around the Dudley Iles seat clearing, which has been under water for months with its own resident ducks and moorhens, still has standing water but negotiable in wellies. There was a duck on there this morning! The orchids are, at last, starting

to flower but I suspect that there will be far fewer this year due to the weather. We will not be alone, the count of snakeshead fritillaries (Fritillaria meleagris) on Iffley meadows was down from 43,000 last year to just 6,000 this year.

In contrast, the Community Meadow is looking wonderful with a spectacular array of colourful flowers including buttercups (3 species), rough hawk-bit, red and white clover, hop trefoil and a few ox-eye daisies and pyramidal orchids. If you have not been out there recently, go and have a look.

Unfortunately, the dumping strip to the north of the meadow, left behind by Sweetcroft developments and still owned by them is rife with weeds, particularly hemlock and thistles'.



East Hanney Parish Council

This month we have finally been able to have the work carried out on the replacement cricket practice net. For some time, the village has been down to just the single practice net after the old one fell into disrepair.

There is now a completely new second net and base. The plan was to have the dual nets restored earlier this year but unfortunately due to the wet ground that was not possible.

The practice nets are available for everyone to use, not just the good members of the Hanney cricket fraternity. Please make good use of them.

The photos show the new net in development and the complete masterpiece!

Thames Water (TW) continue with their consultation for the proposed reservoir. We are opposed to it because of the significant harm that it will cause to the community and our local environment, as well as the significant disruption, should it be given the go ahead.

TW held one of their consultation meetings in East Hanney on Saturday 29th June, and on Tuesday 9th July Oxford County Council debated and held a vote of no confidence in TW, which was carried 29 votes to nil. The Parish Council was involved in the debate and highlighted some of the issues which are and will be experienced in East Hanney.

We encourage all residents to participate in the TW consultation and give reasons for objection to the planned reservoir.





Please also sign the petition: https://you.38degrees.org.uk/p/stopTWreservoir which has been organised by GARD (Group against the Abingdon Reservoir) to ask The Secretary of State for the Environment to stop Thames Water's costly megareservoir plans and fix the leaks now so that GARD can send it to the new Minister.

The Parish Council reviewed the feasibility study looking at restoring or creating a number of ponds in West Hanney.

These ponds would be beneficial to our community and to the environment and result in a significant net gain in biodiversity at these sites.

Restoring the historic pond at North Green proved not to be feasible, but a site at Headings Pond adjacent to the historic pond is feasible although the root protection area of the trees constrain its shape and size.

A new pond sited in the community woodland in an area badly affected by ash dieback is feasible and the council decided to proceed with this option.

Further work will be needed before we are in a position to apply for planning permission.

We are now making plans for a 'one-off' MINI Michaelmas Fayre on 29 September and look forward to your on-going support. The Michaelmas Fayre Team.'

Hilary also told me that there is a national campaign running to secure the future of independent pharmacies.

There are sheets to sign at the counter at retail outlets like **Brett's in Grove**, whom Hilary rightly describes as a great local asset - they deliver prescriptions to many of our community, myself included!

(Hilary added that they were the most reliable during Covid, and the Ops Team here in Hanney, of which Hilary was in charge, was eternally grateful to them.)

Apparently, new analysis by the **National Pharmacy Association (NPA)** shows that two thirds of pharmacies in England have had to cut their opening hours since 2015 due to extreme funding pressures, and around 1,400 pharmacies have closed in the past 10 years, with 10 currently closing each week. That's not good.

Changing Times

Our lives do not pass down straight, narrow paths. We experience good and bad days. Some years we recall with warmth and others with gratitude for no longer having to endure them.

Our relationships develop and change. We hope they will flourish but sometimes they founder. Ideas and beliefs we once cherished become regrets and objects of remorse. Though despair can turn into hope and indifference into love.

And part of our journey is to listen, watch and try to understand. What may once have escaped our notice can move into our hearts.

And we can nurture generosity of spirit so as to allow that an opponent in debate was right. Be ready to accept another's conduct was just a mistake or was from the best of motives.

We may pause to ask ourselves whether we have inadvertently, or intentionally, ignored the plight of our neighbour or even a stranger. We may reflect on why we didn't bother to ask the reason for another's despair, or what the thoughts are of a refugee who has had to flee their homeland to escape deadly peril.

If any of these things resonate then be consoled that none of it is new.

The early Christians knew and wrote about them. They asked and sometimes failed to ask all the same questions. They did the right things when they weren't doing the wrong ones. They debated with each other generously when they weren't accusing each other of heresy. They looked after their neighbour as Jesus had told them when they weren't just looking after themselves. They had compassion for each other when they weren't arguing about a right or wrong religious practice.

And has anything changed over two millennia?

You could be forgiven for believing, at least in our society, it has. Our welfare state looks after our neighbour when we cannot. Racism and its like does not come with the courtesy of state approval. People with mental health challenges aren't ostracised. Homophobia only rears its ugly head in the shadows.

And it seems that even refugees will no longer to be treated as criminals.

Last month's article

from East Hanney Parish Council referred to this recently installed and beautiful bench in Ebbs Lane, in a quiet and secluded spot.

I wasn't sure exactly where it was, so set off to try and find it. Success!...walk up Ebbs

Lane from the village

green in East Hanney. After less than 100 yards is a small turning on the left. Look for the cream-coloured gable end of a lovely stone cottage as you turn into the road. It will be on your right.



Turn left again and now with your back to the gable end of the cottage, head across the patch of grass, trees and undergrowth.

In front of the far wall is located the bench on which you can sit in peace!

The image depicted on the bench is, I think, from the

1914 - 1918 World War, and the pic below shows the children of Hanney School in 1913, the year before it started.

I wonder how it affected their lives as they grew up, and whether any of them served in the conflict in its later years.?



Our Letcombe Brook is a very

special chalk stream - not many of them around - and you can read all about it here:

letcombebrook.org.uk/

To help maintain and manage this precious resource, it is important that dogs - much as we love 'em - are not allowed in it. (See the photo of the sign regarding the water voles who've already made it their home.)

The other day a gent did allow his hounds into the brook, and when the rule/advice/request whatever you want to call it was politely pointed out to him,

I gather he simply reverted to language most impolite that fell far short of the King's English.

That's a shame.... we all have a responsibility to help look after the brook as it flows through Hanney.

Following an enquiry I made to the Letcombe Brook Project - the great folk who look after it for us all - I received this from Jude, aka Judith Verdon, their Project Officer....

'The Letcombe Brook Project has no powers to stop dog owners from letting their dogs swim in the brook. However, due to the presence of water voles (particularly in

East Hanney), which are an endangered and protected species, we do approach dog owners to ask them to keep their dogs out of the brook and off the banks so as to minimise the disturbance to this important but vulnerable population. Dogs can also introduce harmful chemicals into the water if they have been treated with flea/ tick treatment: see Pet treatments could be harmina freshwater life — Freshwater Biological Association (fba.org.uk)

This is another good reason to ask people to keep their dogs out of watercourses.'
Thanks for this Jude, and for all your efforts regarding the brook!
So, whilst your doggies may enjoy a splash about in the brook, I'm sure they would understand if you explained to them why they are not allowed in it!


ings, covered boxes, knitting, bags, toys, children's clothes and so many treasured creations.
