R. died, Christopher has overseen the publication of dozens of his father's works. Chris died aged 95 in 2020.

I've just been reading "Hanney History Walk" which, despite not being a resident of Hanney itself, I found fascinating. In it I did, however, find something worth expanding on.

It concerns the false windows of West Hanney House. These were almost certainly put in for symmetry but were, I suspect, deliberately falsified for tax avoidance. In the 1700s, a property was taxed according to the number of windows it had. This (early form of Council tax?) was introduced in 1696 and lasted until revoked in 1851. It resulted in bricked-up windows being found in many buildings of that date and it's unpopularity is reputed to have given rise to the saying of "daylight robbery".

This from GARD (Group Against Reservoir Development)....The news that the Secretary of State (SoS) has approved Thames Water's (TW) Resource Management Plan with SESRO (the reservoir) at the centre is greeted with astonishment and deep resentment.

He's overruled his Environment Agency's (EA) advice that the plans should be rejected because of concerns about the reservoir's resilience to drought and lack of proof that it provides the best value for money.

The County, the Vale District and Abingdon Town Council all responded with GARD and residents, expressing strong opposition to the public consultation.

It is shameful that a week later, before analysis of the results, the scheme has been progressed to the next stage.

The EA also advised more public scrutiny. A Public Inquiry, called for by GARD, reiterated recently by our local MPs Olly Glover and Layla Moran, is the only way of getting at the truth when confronted by an organisation with such a poor track record of openness as TW.

The SoS has missed the opportunity to establish the facts and remove unresolved issues which remain on cost, construction, environmental damage, post-construction safety, flooding hazards and crucially, if it

is actually needed at all. Leaking more than twice the maximum supply of this Reservoir, TW must also be held to account to reduce leaks to at least industry average. This is certainly not the end of the road. GARD will continue its campaign against this monstrosity. The Reservoir needs final approval at Development Consent Order proceedings in 2026, and we will be contesting this project all the way. This reservoir remains the least drought resilient, longest delivery-time, most environmentally damaging and disruptive 'solution' to the coming water shortages in the south-east. A high-risk construction like this is not the sort of project to be entrusted to a company which might not survive beyond next Spring.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



I am struggling with the 20 mph speed limit through the villages. I don't like driving at 20! It upsets the normal way I drive. It is making me concentrate on something that has always been automatic and unconscious. When I do drive at 20. I find there is often an irritated and pushy driver tailgating me and urging me on. What do I do? Try and help them to learn the new habit or give in and speed up? I have been reflecting on why it is so difficult to change from 30 to 20. The problem is that it involves retraining my brain to do something it does automatically. When I leave the house I naturally take the car up through the gears to 4th, but you can't drive at 20 in 4th gear. I have to change back down to third. Even if I want to drive at 20, this is maddening. Most of us don't want to go so slowly, especially when we are late or it's the rush hour and everyone is in a hurry.

When we are driving we are doing something at which we are 'unconsciously competent'. We don't thing about it. We just drive. Being told to drive at 20 shoves us down to the level of 'conscious incompetence'. I am now having to think about how I drive and to re-train my brain to stay in a lower gear and adjust the pressure on the accelerator. There are all these good reasons why it is better to drive more slowly: less accidents, more

safety for bicycles and pedestrians, less air pollution, less petrol. As one village sign said, 'Go slow - see more!' But change is difficult – especially when we don't want to slow down.

Apparently we use a different part of the brain when we are driving – the limbic system, the more primitive part of the brain where we are reacting instinctively, and often in 'fight/flight' mode. Perhaps that is why we shout and swear more when we are driving? Changing to 20 mph involves the 'pre-frontal cortex' where we do our rational thinking. It works more slowly and brings logic to bear on something far from our conscious way of working.

So even if we want to learn to drive at 20 through the Hanneys, it is a tricky task to change our habits. This is probably true of most efforts to change our ways: picking up litter and dog poo, recycling plastic, eating more healthily and saving the planet. So I have decided to work at retraining my brain on the 20 mph issue because I remember my Dad's definition of old age: 'Old age is the amount of pain you feel when confronted by change!' And there are so many more important things than driving at 20 that I need to change as well.

This from our Community **Speedwatch** member Andrew Wastie...

'Speeding has reached epidemic proportions,

necessitating a fundamental shift in how we tackle the issue.

This shift must redefine our approach to community volunteers roles in road safety. Traditional enforcement methods and broad campaigns have seen limited success over the past decade.

Currently, large-scale, focused education is primarily delivered through Speed Awareness Courses, which only occur after an offence has been committed

Modern, preventative strategies like Community Speed Watch (CSW) remain under-utilised, and it's time to change that. Research shows that around 97% of speeding offences, excluding CSW observations, are detected by speed cameras. These cameras are typically fixed at known

roadside locations, and familiar to residents and regular commuters. Despite the so-called Halo effect, these cameras have minimal impact in areas not covered by this technology.

In rural areas, the risk of fatalities is four times higher than in urban settings.

While the tragedy of fatalities and serious

injuries cannot be overstated, speeding poses a broader threat to the overall safety and well-being of the community.

Inconsistent enforcement is unlikely to change socially accepted

behaviours, especially when most of those caught speeding are not habitual offenders or do not perceive themselves as such. Achieving greater compliance with traffic laws requires more than enforcement alone. In this context, CSW's personalised educational approach is equally effective in addressing the problem.

To succeed in this endeavour, organising a large-scale, proactive community volunteer effort is essential.

The Hanneys' community deeply appreciates the dedication of our CSW volunteers. Their commitment is crucial in keeping our roads safe for all users.'



St James Churchyard

Many folk have been commenting for some time, in not very complimentary terms it must be said, about the state of our churchyard here in West Hanney.

As is her wont, Mother Nature (MN) has set about her usual work of making things grow, regardless of whether they were pretty flowers or nasty weeds and stinging nettles. It meant the churchyard looked like this. See pics on the right.

The beautiful chest tomb on the left hand side of the path up to the main entrance was barely visible from the gate.

For all the years I can remember since we moved to Hanney in 2000, the churchyard had looked like it does in the bottom pic.

Indeed, for a couple of those years, I myself cut the grass in the front churchyard, strimming round the graves, paths and steps as I went.





I got real satisfaction from doing what I'm somewhat immodestly claiming, was a reasonably good job. Recently however a policy change by the powers that be in the C of E's complex hierarchy has seen an adoption, apparently by many 'country' churchyards, of a 'biodiversity' approach... essentially very little cutting, allowing MN to go wild!

I confess to not being a fan, but in fairness to the church, I asked our churchwardens to send me a piece explaining the current situation. Stuart Cakebread obliged - see page 18 - and I urge you to read it. You may agree with him or not? Feel free to let me know your thoughts.... I suspect this story has legs.



Meantime, some work has recently been done on the churchyard, and from the gate it now looks like this.





Final point...the church and churchyard belong to us all, not merely the folk who run the church and preach in it, or go there every Sunday to worship. For them of course it's a house of god, for others, non-believers included, it's simply a beautiful historic building, and whatever you do or don't believe, let us know your opinion.

OK Stuart my man, give us your best shot!

'The Church of England's policy on country churchyards is that they should be managed so as to promote biodiversity and conservation by providing a safe habitat for wild flora and fauna. I emphasise managed as it is not simply a matter of leaving it untended but being sympathetic to the encouragement of new and sometimes relatively rare species of wildflowers and grasses and to provide a safe nesting and living space for wild mammals, insects and birds.

Experts advise that it is likely to take at least 3 years for the establishment of a wide diversity of wildflowers and plants and to enable this to happen grasses and plants need to be given time to drop their seeds. Hence there will be periods, certainly in the first 2 or 3 years, when grass and plants are left to seed and may look untidy. Timing is everything and unpredictable weather (or just weather!) may at times interrupt the cycle.

We are working with our contractors to make the front of the churchvard presentable at all times. We have fallen short on occasion but lessons have been learned. What can be problematic is DIY cutting of grasses and flowers especially beyond the curtilage of an individual grave. Our contractors recently had to spend half of their allotted time clearing up a tremendous mess left after one such episode. We should be grateful if such, no doubt well intentioned efforts, are avoided and left to us. The principal habitat and haven for wild animals, birds and insects is the back of the main churchyard i.e. behind the church building. This will be regularly mown during the season to maintain paths and scythed probably twice. There are no recent graves here and I am excluding the cremation plots on the west side which are regularly maintained.


The dogleg is maintained as a working graveyard by our wonderful volunteers. Both I and my fellow churchwarden, Chris Reason, welcome constructive criticism and suggestions.


