

I was at West Hanney Parish Council's last meeting in November

- I try and go to nearly all of them - at which various items were discussed including the 'precept' which is set annually. This is the sum of money that comes out of your Council tax each year to fund the Parish Council's activities. Good news... the PC agreed that there will be no increase to our precept this year.

More good news...the PC agreed to make a donation of $\pounds600$ to St James School for the purchase of phonics books - see page 14.

'Speedwatch' still need volunteers, indeed main man Cllr Farrag informed us that the team was down to a core of just four. Community Woodland was also discussed. Plenty of hoops to jump through before it happens however, and mega bucks needed, with a final figure of well over £30,000 being suggested as the likely cost. Some of that will be received from grants.

The pond will be approx. 20m square with a 4ft wooden stock fence round it....'elf and safety' and all that good stuff! It will be clay lined, two metres at its deepest, and will be filled by rain. If it overflows or dries up completely so be it.

The 'pond god' works in mysterious ways methinks, so quite what its future will be, who knows! It's not been born yet!

Wednesday Bus Service 85, West Hanney to and from Wantage

West Hanney resident Bill Falkenau has been in touch to tell me that he has used the above service on a couple of occasions. He advises that... 'there is only one resident from West Hanney who is a regular user. Four passengers from Charney Bassett also took advantage of the service. There are 16 seats on the bus. Bill added... 'The driver mentioned that there were also regular users from Denchworth. It was handy to have the service available when I needed it. I fear that if there is no greater use from residents of West Hanney, the service will be lost, (use it or lose it!) There is no charge and the driver and passengers are on first name terms. Using it is a good opportunity to get out and about and meet others in a relaxing environment. Much less stressful than driving into Wantage.'

Well said Bill... the bus leaves West Hanney Village Green at 10.26am every Wednesday, arriving in the Market Place, Wantage at 10.46am, having been to Grove and the Wantage Health Centre on the way. It returns to Hanney, leaving Wantage at 13.05pm, so you'll have had a couple of hours to spend your money!

Some sad news from East

Hanney....this from resident Steve Lee.... "During the recent summer months some of the residents of The Nurseries have experienced various, & an increasing number of, incidents which effectively is blatant anti-social behaviour. This coincided with the opening of our park area. Those closest to the park area & the footpath to the main Hunter Avenue entrance road unfortunately bore the brunt of these unsavoury activities.

One of the consequences, in a coordinated bid to deal with the problem, is the formation of a Neighbourhood Watch scheme for the residents of The Nurseries. Inaugurated at the beginning of October, the scheme has a number of immediate ambitions:

Crime prevention; A community that is better connected; Sharing important information with other local Neighbourhood Watch schemes, the police, & local authorities (including housing associations); Create a protocol for reporting issues; Signage to promote the scheme & warn unwanted visitors; Signage to advise vehicle traffic to respect our shared road network; Organise regular resident patrols; A platform to discuss related issues.



We have the support of East Hanney Parish Council & have already had help with signage placement. The Parish Council have also offered to supply hi-vis jackets for those in the scheme who have vol-

unteered to patrol our patch. To join our scheme <u>East Hanney Hunter</u> <u>Avenue | Neighbourhood Watch | National</u> <u>network | Local Watch areas | Community</u> <u>crime prevention groups (ourwatch.org.uk)</u> The scheme name is "Hunter Avenue" Pictured below are Nurseries resident Richard Mathews & Cllr. Tackling shoplifting in southern Oxfordshire

One of the common myths about shoplifting is that it is linked to the cost of living. Whilst there will inevitably be some exceptions, we see that a significant amount of shoplifting is related to addiction (drink and drugs), but the biggest rise is actually from organised crime. Even in our more rural areas, sadly some retailers have been targeted but help is at hand; and the new Retail Crime Strategy that I launched earlier this year has made supporting retailers a higher priority for the police.

Over the last year across South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse the number of charges for shoplifting has more than doubled (up by 106% so far this year), showing that the work to tackle prolific offenders is paying off. The police have identified the top suspects locally and as a result many are now behind bars.

Part of the effort to work more closely with shop staff is to increase reporting. We

know that all too often shoplifting or assaults on staff can go unreported. Sometimes people feel the police won't act - well, if it is never reported, they certainly can't act! To help encourage reporting and information sharing I have funded a new system called Disc, which is being rolled out free to any retail business locally that wants to sign up.

The app allows them to report more easily to the police - of course if there's a crime happening now, always call 999 - and crucially to share images from CCTV and mobile phones of suspects. These are shared both with the police and neighbouring businesses. I have been out with the police in Wantage, Didcot and Wallingford, talking to staff about their experience and getting them to sign up to the free scheme.

I picked up my bag, containing the notes and items for my interview presentation, along with a list of questions that I had about this new role, took a deep breath, prayed I would remember everything that I had prepared, smiled, and went into the interview.

It was one of those moments that felt like I had come to a fork in the road. I could either go this way or that way. I would either be asked to take on this new role or I would remain in my current role. One way or another, things were going to change.

And things will change...while some things will remain the same.

For the last eight years, I have been the Associate Vicar for the Vale Benefice, serving the church congregations and local communities for Denchworth, East Challow, Grove and East and West Hanney. It has been my privilege to have taken weddings, funerals and baptisms, led festival services and to have been involved with our local schools.

Covering a large and growing population has meant that I have not been able to get to know as many people as I would have liked, but I value the relationships that I have built.

The interview went well; I got the job!

From January, I will become the Vicar for the Vale Benefice, continuing to live and work here, but taking on the senior vicar role, with a new responsibility for leadership and oversight.

This will be a gradual transition, as one of the first things that I will need to do is work toward appointing a new Associate Vicar so that we can go back up to having two vicars.

Next year, will be a time for us as a group of four churches to reflect on how God is calling us to serve our local congregations and community. We feel that we are here to live lives of loving God and loving our neighbours, and we will take time to work out what this might look like over the coming weeks, months and years.

With every new year, comes another 12 months of challenges and opportunities, setbacks and stand-out moments, beginnings and endings. For me, it feels like I am about to switch tracks and begin a new route through a familiar landscape. I am looking forward to this new adventure!

Whatever 2025 has in store for us, my prayer is that we can all find ways to support and care for those around us, learn how to live together even when we disagree, practise giving and receiving forgiveness, and find ways to help more than we harm.

Despite these challenges, a dedicated group of parents has set a goal of raising £3000 to purchase a second set of phonics



books for the early years classes. This initiative is a testament to the power of our local community, one which we should all feel proud to be a part of.

The school and parents are incredibly grateful for the support of East and West Hanney Parish Councils, the Community Shop, the Michaelmas Fayre and Hanney News for all coming together to fund this valuable set of books for our children. Thank you to all involved!'

And can I add a massive 'well done' to all who've made this happen, particularly those parents who've worked very hard on this ambitious fund-raising project.

Since the Michaelmas Fayre was started back in 2013 all the profits are given out in grants to Hanney organisations. Bit of an emphasis on **pubs** this month, and here's another story of a now deceased hostelry that many of our more mature readers will doubtless remember. I refer to the Crown on the A338 in East Hanney, which was owned by Abingdon based Morland Brewery. Now a private house, though, as you'll see,



the very decorative ceramic plaque on the wall to the right of the front door has thoughtfully been retained by the current owners...thank you!

A close-up look reveals that it depicts an artist brandishing his palette in a rather wild fashion in his left hand, whilst he clutches what looks like a glass of beer in his right, which he appears to be studying as if he's going to paint its portrait!.

A bit of research on the wibbly wobbly web revealed that the plaque was designed by Reginald Bell, and

was produced by Poole Pottery or the Carter Tile Works. The painter depicted is known as "The Artist Fayer".

The plaque is extremely colourful as befits the artist, and, quoting from a Morlands brochure: 'An interesting connection of the Morland family with the famous 18th century artist of the same name is still preserved by the Company's Trade Mark, which depicts a painter of that period.'

Apparently the landscape painter, George Morland (1763-1804), was a member of the family, and that is how brushes and palette come to feature in the Morland trademark. In more recent times, actually 1980, the pub featured in an article in a local newspaper, written by Doreen and John Sherwood in which they stated that the Crown was an early Victorian building, not without character.

The piece went on to reveal that ... 'The food is straightforward pub fayre, but with one or two items you would not normally find to lift it somewhat out of the average rut.' Rather an odd turn of phrase methinks? We go on to learn more about the food on offer, which includes scrambled eggs on toast for 50p, soup (tinned) at 25p, 'basket things from 60p (sausage) to £1.30 (chicken)'. The steak was apparently first class and so were the chips, 'which are obviously a popular product.' observes the journalist who added that the wine was 40p a glass, but most of the locals drank the Morlands beer! I wonder when the pub closed down? Anyone remember?



And still on pubs, I've mentioned The Chequers at Charney Bassett this month, and here's a lovey old photograph of it, taken around the very end of the 1800's - maybe early 1900s, by a famous Victorian Oxfordshire-based photographer Henry Taunt. He also took some in Hanney, and often included children in his pics. This one is no different... four girls stand very

formally in front of the pub, and spaced well



apart. The second girl from the left has a protective arm round a much younger girl. Someone - could be a young woman? - sits on the bench outside the pub, whilst a boy sits cross-legged on the ground near the girls with what could be a football on his lap. Another boy lies propped on his left elbow with his back to camera, very near the delightful old four wheel cart.

Both boys wear caps and the girls look to be dressed in their Sunday best, at Henry Taunt's request I would guess.

The modern snap, taken in 2023 shows it hasn't changed much, apart from that lovely big sign above the porch has now gone as has the big outdoor light hanging above the door.

And what of its future now landlords Ian and Jacqui have moved down to us here in East Hanney?

On Friday, 8th Nov I wrote to a company who I believe may have recently purchased it from Brakspear the brewery who owned it in Ian and Jacqui's time there. As I go to press a week later I've heard nowt...not a sausage. Maybe I got the wrong company. If anyone knows anything, please share it. The Chequers is / was (?) the only pub in the village.
