statisticians that I spotted recently on the BBC News website...

949 new homes a year are required by government targets set in 2024 for the Vale of White Horse.

1,218 homes were added per year on average in the Vale since 2021, so nearly 300 more than the new target. 1,130 new homes were added in the year to March 24. And as for our Planners? Well, they granted 82% of planning applications in the year

ending June 2024. This compares with 71% of applications across England overall. Does this suggest they're a bunch of softies, or maybe just that the quality of applications is better? Who knows?

I'm sure it's not just folks who like figures that will find this worth knowing, but also to any of us - there are many - who reckon that all these new houses, as well as providing homes of course, also have some negative effects.

These are difficult times for

many folk, and here in Hanney we have a charity, 'The Hanney Parochial Trust' that may be able to help. It is an amalgamation of several local charities, the first set up back in 1604!

I am the Chair of the board of Trustees, which includes both current Parish Council Chairs.

If you know anyone who lives in East or West Hanney and is in genuine financial need, please ask them to contact me directly, in strictest confidence.

We are now also working closely with 'Vale Community Impact' (VCI) so feel free to approach them first if you'd rather. Their website is here: www.vci.org.uk, tel: 01235 765348.

Cutting rural crime

Rural crime - specifically defined as things like the theft of farm machinery, equipment, damage to crops and offences such as hare coursing - can have a huge impact on farming businesses, not to mention the real issues of safety for individuals.

Thankfully rural crime is falling locally. Across Thames Valley it is down 24% over the last 12 months and in southern Oxfordshire it's down 33% but that's not by accident.

Last year I secured additional funding from the Home Office for work focussed specifically in Oxfordshire.

Thames Valley Police have teamed up with local District Councils, forming a Rural Crime Partnership and delivering the following:

Using undercover cameras and off-road bikes, officers can now better monitor remote areas and track down offenders who think they can't be reached.

Farmers have received free security reviews and DNA marking kits for their equipment, making it much harder for thieves to get away and easier to return stolen items if something happens.

Rural Crime Advisor: A dedicated advisor was recruited, to be out in the community, offering helpful advice, meeting with local farmers and businesses, and keeping rural industries safer.

Tackling Fly-Tipping: New surveillance tools are helping councils catch and



prosecute those who dump waste, keeping rural areas cleaner and more beautiful.

More officers have been recruited to the Rural Crime Taskforce, making it one of the largest and certainly one of the most effective in the country. They recognise that many of these offences are part of organised crime.

The taskforce is identifying and focusing on the most dangerous and prolific offenders. In fact they have been so successful that whilst there has been a reduction in crime here, other police areas have seen increases as criminals target other places.

None of us are safe, unless we're all safe; so we've now established a South East Partnership Against Rural Crime - joining together neighbouring police forces so that we can target criminals all the way from the farms they target to the ports where they try to export stolen goods.

With these measures, our rural areas are becoming safer places thanks to the hard work and dedication of Thames Valley Police officers.

I wonder what you feel about February? It can feel like just another month of winter to get through before March comes and we can start to enjoy Spring. Not my favourite month!

Those of us who enjoy gardening will be especially aware of waiting for Spring to come. And all of us will look forward to lighter mornings and a change from long dark winter evenings.

None of us likes waiting. If we are waiting for exam results or the result of a job application it can be an anxious time. Or if we are waiting for a bus on a cold wet night after just missing the previous one, it can be frustrating!

Some kinds of waiting can be more positive. For example waiting in pregnancy for a longed for child can be a joyful kind of waiting. However even this is not without anxiety, and in the later stages there can be a yearning to hurry up and get there! But on the negative side, waiting a long time for much needed surgery can be painful, distressing and debilitating. How do we cope with waiting? Perhaps sometimes by realising that during a waiting period, there can still be many good things in life. It was Francis Bacon, the sixteenth century philosopher, who wisely

pointed out:

"Prosperity is not without many fears and distastes; and adversity is not without comforts and hopes."

Even in a difficult time of waiting, we may still find "comforts and hopes". Perhaps the trick is to notice them and still enjoy them, even when life is difficult.

"Comforts" may come especially from the loving support of friends or family, which can make a huge difference.

What about "hopes"? Sometimes we can start to see signs of better things to come, and our hopes for the future begin to feel closer and more possible. Like seeing early Spring flowers in February - or even the snowdrops which are already flowering as I write this in January – all giving us a sense of the promise of Spring to come Waiting can be frustrating and demoralising. But if it is not too painful, and we can look around for positive signs for the future, it can begin to turn into hopeful anticipation.

May we enjoy fresh spring times, not only in the weather, but also in our lives.

ridge, who lived at the Chequers, their dad William Kerridge being the landlord - He was a busy man since I think he was also the village blacksmith!

Obituary - Terry Flynn

25th November 1933 - 21st December 2024

When Terry was a small boy during World War Two, his Father was away in the R.A.F. and his Mother brought him out of London to the safer environment of living with his grandparents in Hanney.

A photo shows him dressed in 'plus fours and 'hob-nailed' boots, attending Hanney School - later Faringdon School then going on to do a carpentry apprenticeship at Challow Foundry.

At the age of 18 he was called up for National Service with the R.A.F.

On completion he was lured to the successful M.G. Car Company in Abingdon, where he worked for 27 years (and was presented with his gold watch.)

Terry's real passion was football, in which he excelled, being the youngest player, at the age of 16, to play in the final of the North Berks Cup and to win a medal.

He enjoyed his golf , later becoming a very active member of Kingston & Southmoor

Bowls Club.

In 1959 we were married, and went on to have two daughters, Julie and Sally.

Terry enjoyed being a family man and was very involved in encouraging the girls with their activities and hobbies.

More recently he had a daily routine and target to have a slow walk to the top of the lane. A <u>slow</u> walk because so many would stop him to have a friendly chat.

By his family and all who knew him he will be sadly missed. Wherever he went and with whoever he met he was always the friendly gentleman with the big smile...a popular Hanney Character.

Jennifer Ann Diment 14/3/1940 - 14/12/2024

I knew Jenny for a long time. Jenny's parents and mine were friends and lived in the same road in Dorchester, or Casterbridge, as Thomas Hardy called it. It is quite likely that Jenny and I were taken for walks in our prams or pushchairs together.

We met often during our schooldays, sharing the same piano teacher, and singing in the same choir. We both went on from our separate grammar schools to London University.

The letter telling Jenny she had been awarded a degree in French arrived on the morning of our Wedding Day in 1962. We lived for the first four years of our married life in Oxford with Jenny working at Pergamon Press under Robert Maxwell. Oxford was a convenient place to live, with plenty to do, but we guessed we would pre-

We moved to East Hanney in 1966 and on our first day there discovered how friendly it was, and loved it.

fer village life.

We were soon involved in village activities. The new Hanney War Memorial Hall was built in 1969 and the following year I arranged some lighting in it for the WI Drama Group in which Jenny acted, and that became Hanney Drama Group when they needed male members of the cast.

Jenny was also much involved with Hanney WI, and we attended the Gardening Club and History Group. We enjoyed many trips to France and Germany with the local Twinning Association, took our turns behind the counter at Hanney Community Shop, and were enthusiastic members of Hanney Wine Circle.

I shall never know how Jenny found time



for all that as well as coping with our two children, a Great Dane, house and garden. When the younger of our two children started primary school in the village the vicar said to Jenny, 'Now that you have time on your hands you could start the newsletter that people have been asking for', and so Hanney News was born. That newsletter, which

Jenny edited for its first 25 years, is still being published, as you can see.

Jenny took a postgraduate course in Oxford to qualify as a teacher. After one or two temporary positions she began teaching French at Larkmead School in Abingdon, which she did for 17 years before taking early retirement.

Most of our parents' generation had only very short retirements and often only as single people, but Jenny and I were fortunate enough to enjoy over twenty years together after we both retired from full-time work, packing into that time numerous European tours and a few trips much further afield.

From 2015 our lives gradually slowed

down, as Jenny's Parkinson's Disease took its course, and by 2017 the maintenance of our house and garden became too difficult, so after more than 51 years in Hanney we moved to a Wantage retirement flat. We still managed some outings and visits, but at a less hectic pace, and it was only for the final seven months that Jenny had to move to a care home, where family and friends could visit her frequently, and she could receive all the specialized care she needed.

Our whole family is grateful for the many kind words of sympathy we have received.


